2. Objectives of Agenda 2063 AIHSRN Project

GOAL of AGENDA 2063 HSRNP: Accelerating the physical, and economic Integration of Africa, through Continental High Speed Railway Connectivity (i.e. The AIHSRNP)

1st Objective: Agenda 2063 Results Framework, sets a 2023 target of completing at least, 20% of the construction on the first regional high speed rail pilot project - linking the first set of cooperating Country-Capital Cities, of the African Union – beginning 2020.

2nd Objective: Agenda 2063 Results Framework, sets a 2025 target of completing at least, 20% of the construction on the second regional high speed rail pilot project - linking the second set of cooperating Country-Capital Cities, of the African Union – beginning 2023.



Key Guiding Principles

- 1) Connectivity of Capitals and Economic hubs: Given the pan-African nature of the continental high speed rail project, a key objective is connectivity of Africa's Capital cities and megacities, including but not limited to, commercial hubs/economic zones, and tourist destinations...
- 2) Integrated Approach: The viability and sustainability of the AIHSRN, will largely depend on the extent, to which its development is linked to the planning, development and operation of existing/planned national and regional HSR networks, power and electricity and ICT infrastructure facilities, of the continent.
- 3) Inter-operability: The existing conventional ("low speed") freight and passenger rail network in Africa, essentially, form the backbone of the continent's railway infrastructure assets contributing significantly, to the development and operations of Africa's manufacturing, mining, and industrial outputs.
- 4) Selection of High Speed Rail Routes/Corridors: Cognizance of the magnitude of the investment required of the AIHSRN project key selected routes/corridors, based on a proven business case, will be piloted, for replication.





Financing the Agenda 2063 – First 10 Year Implementation Plan:

Broad-based Perspective

- Domestic resource mobilization (DRM) is meant to contribute at least 75% to 90% of the financing of Agenda 2063 on average per country
- Enhanced fiscal resource mobilization;
- (iii) Maximization of natural resource rents OGM, agriculture, maritime, tourism, etc.;
- (iv) Leveraging of the increasingly important pool of African institutional savings – pension funds, central bank foreign exchange reserves, sovereign wealth funds and capital market development;
- Curbing of illicit financial flows;
- (vi) Efficiency gains: improved governance, and fighting corruption to stop financial leakages and wastages in government.

- **Other Sources of Financing:**
- Agenda 2063 should also be rightly financed through external financing mechanisms including FDI, official development assistance (ODA);
- Financial cooperation from emerging development partners such as **BRICS** countries, Arab world, etc.;
- (iii) FDI, PPP and other forms of investment partnerships;
- (iv) Leveraging Diaspora remittances and Savings;
- Improved access to the international financial markets

Agenda 2063 - HSR Resource Mobilization Architecture

Agenda 2063 Results Framework set out a Resource Mobilization Strategy (RMS) for the First Ten Year Implementation Plan of Agenda 2063, and by extension >>>> Agenda 2063 HSRN Project.

☐ Under the direction of the Agenda 2063 Ministerial Committee and the AUC.

- The African Development Bank is the lead institution in facilitating, coordinating, monitoring and evaluation of Agenda 2063 RMS>>>>HSR;
- ➤ Key stakeholders in the implementation of the RMS at the continental level in addition to the AU and AfDB include UN-ECA at continental level;
- ➤ Other Stakeholders: RECs, regional DFIs and stock exchanges at the regional level. Regional associations such as the African DFI associations, the African Venture Capital Association (AVCA) and the Association of African Stock Exchange will also play a significant role in the mobilization process.



6. CONCLUSIONS: Key Messages

- 1. Agenda 2063 Results Framework provides the framework for the planning, development and implementation of Agenda 2063 AIHSRN Initiative.
- 2. As a regional Initiative Agenda 2063-AIHSRN Project (especially, the 1st set of Pilot Projects) as a key driver of Regional Integration will be realized only through Regional Cooperation, between/amongst Member States, with RECs, and Continental Stakeholders (AUC, NPCA, AfDB, ECA) playing their respective roles and mandates.
- 3. National Readiness for Implementation of AIHSRN Initiative (i.e., domestication, ownership, and reflection of AIHSRN) in national development plans (NDPs/PIPs) is a pre-requisite for success of this transformation agenda of the African Union.
- 4. We must develop a strategy, to coalesece the 'willing and readiness', of member countries, and their respective RECs to begin the commencement of the implementation of the first regional high speed railway pilot project, by December 2020.
